Complete all sections of this application. Your responses should be typed or printed in ink. Pay particular attention to your intended enrollment date. Your application cannot be acted upon unless all items are either answered or designated as no applicable (N/A).

We strongly recommend that all your application materials be submitted together. This includes the application fee, official transcript(s) in an envelope sealed by your school(s), and your courses in progress. SAT/ACT scores should be sent directly from the College Board or ACT. Mail the completed application and the nonrefundable \$70 application fee to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, 106 Whichard Building, Mail Stop 517, East Carolina University, Greenville NC, 27858-4353. Please include the applicants full name in the memo section of the check on the money order.

After admission and before entering East Carolina, you must also submit an immunization and medical record. All students entering a North Carolina college or university are required to provide this information.

If admission is offered, a nonrefundable \$100 enrollment deposit is required for fall term applicants by May 1 to secure your place in the class.

Please note that admission to the university does not garuntee admission to all degree programs, many of which have additional application procedures and requirements.

Your failure to provide complete, accurate, and truthful information on this application will be grounds to deny or withdraw your admission, or dismiss you after enrollment. Please note Undergraduate Admissions will use e-mail for official application communication.

Application status

FRESHMAN

A freshman is a student who has never attended a college or university since graduating from high school.

To be eligible for admission as a freshman, you must have completed the following upon high school graduation:

English - 4 course units in English emphasizing grammar, composition, and literature

Language - 2 course units of the same language other than English

Mathematics - 4 course units including algebra I, geometry, algebra II, and a higher-level mathematics course for which algebra II is a prerequisite

Natural science - 3 course units; 1 unit must be a life or biological science, 1 unit must be a physical science, and 1 unit must be a labratory science

Social studies - 2 course units; 1 unit must be U.S. history

Arts - 1 or more course units recommended

During your senior year, we recommend that you take a foreign language, mathematics, and a natural science course in addition to English.

A complete Application for freshman admission includes:

- a completed application form
- a check, money order, or credit card authorization for the \$70 nonrefundable application fee
- SAT/ACT scores sent directly from an official testing agency; writing scores are required.
- a high school transcript sealed by the school showing class rank and senior grade point average in a 4.0 scale and senior-year courses
- transcripts from all postsecondary schools attended

TRANSFER

A transfer is a student who will have attended a postsecondary institution since high school graduation and has a minimum of 30 semester (45 quarter) hours of transferable work at the time he or she proposes to enroll at East Carolina*. Transfer students must have a 2.5 cumulative grade point average both cumulative and on transferable courses, as computed by East Carolina. Applicants who will have completed fewer than 30 semester hours (45 quarter) hours will also be required to meet the freshman requirements (high school grades, SAT/ACT scores, and high school courses). All transfer students under the age of 24 must provide proof that they have completed the minimum course requirements in high school, unless they have already earned an AA or AS/AFA degree. Transferring students are encouraged to apply after completeing one semester of full-time, college-level course work.

A complete application to transfer to East Carolina includes:

- a completed application form
- a check, money order, or credit card authorization for the nonrefundable application fee
- an official final high school transcript
- courses in progress from any school currently attending
- final official transcripts from all postsecondary schools attended

REMOVAL OF HIGH SCHOOL DEFICIENCIES

All students who completed high school in 1998 or later must meet the same secondary school requirements as freshmen. If you did not complete those courses by your high school graduation date, you must qualify for admission in one of the following ways:

- 1. Complete 6 semester (9 quarter) transferable hours each in English, mathematics, science, social science, and a foreign language from a regionally accredited institution. *All transfer credits must be recieved by a regionally accredited institution.
- Earn an associate of arts (AA), associate of science (AS), or an associate of fine arts (AFA) degree from a regionally accredited institution. An associate of applied science degree (AAS) will note meet this requirement.
- 3. Complete the general education core at a North Carolina community college.

SECOND UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE CANDIDATE

A second-degree candidate is a student who holds a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution and wishes to work towards another in a second academic area. Second-degree candidates must complete the "school/department" and "major" items on the first page of the application.

A complete application for a candidate for a second degree includes:

- a completed application form
- a check, money order, or credit card authorization for the nonrefunable application fee
- final official transcript from the postsecondary school from which the degree was awarded

^{*}Transfer applicants must have completed, with a grade of C or better, 6 credits in English equivalent to ENGL 1100 and 1200 and 3 credits in mathematics equivalent to MATH 1065 (College algebra)

In 2004-2005, the six year graduation rate for students who entered East Carlina University in the fall of 1999 on a full-time basis was 54.4 percent. Also, an additional 4.7 percent of this entering class went on to graduate from another UNC institution, thus raising the six-year graduation rate to 59.1 percent. Additionally, 4.6 percent of the class is still enrolled at ECU or at another UNC institution; thus, the overall persistence rate is 63.7 percent.
